Thank you for choosing to use a Social Story for the **2022 Toyota Wheelchair AFL National Championship at Diamond Valley Sport and Fitness Centre**. This Social Story is written by <u>Access Ability Australia</u> and is suited for a person who may live with autism spectrum disorder, alanguage disorder, social communication difficulties and/or a cognitive delay/disability.

For your Social Story to be successful, we recommend you follow these guidelines.

- · Read Social Story often and preferably 2 weeks in advance of visit.
- · Social Story to be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.
- · Be calm, comfortable and honest when reading a Social Story.
- · Help the participant comprehend key points and consistently monitor for level of understanding.
- · Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Social Story to celebrate success.

I am going to watch 2022 Toyota Wheelchair AFL National Championship at Diamond Valley Sports and Fitness Centre.



There are lots of different sporting events at Diamond Valley Sports and Fitness Centre.

Today, I am going to watch wheelchair football.



Wheelchair football is played in competition between sporting clubs.

These are called games or matches.

People watching sporting events are called spectators.



When I arrive for the event, I will see people at reception who work at the centre.

I might also see people in high vis vests.

They are called staff.



There are toilets at Diamond Valley Sports and Fitness Centre.




There is a café where I can buy something to eat or drink.



Wheelchair football will be played on courts.

All the courts are numbered.

My support person or a staff member can help me find the right court to go to for the event I am watching.



There will be seats in the court for me to sit and watch the event.

There are also seats upstairs for me to watch the event in the court below.

I might be sitting with lots of other people too.

I will try to stay seated in my chair so the people behind me can see the game.



It can get very noisy in the courts.

I might hear balls bouncing.

I might hear referees blowing their whistles.

I might hear buzzers when it is time to for the game to start or stop.

I might hear people talking, clapping and cheering.



Sometimes it might sound loud.

That is okay.

Sporting events can be exciting.



To help with the noise, I can bring my ear defenders or ear plugs.

I can go outside for some fresh air.

I can go to the quiet space in the multipurpose room.

Staff can show me where the multipurpose room is.

I can take my support person with me.



There will be a big clock in the court which shows how much time is left before the game is finished.

At the end of the game, people might support the players by clapping or cheering.



There might be an award ceremony at the wheelchair football event and somebody talking on a microphone.

I might watch the players receive a certificate, trophy or medal.

People might clap and cheer the players at the award ceremony.



When the event is finished, lots of people might be leaving the centre.

It might feel busy and sound loud.

I can wait with my support person and leave when it is quieter.



Diamond Valley Sports and Fitness Centre is a great place to watch the 2022 Toyota Wheelchair AFL National Championship.
