Thank you for choosing to use an Access Key for Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre. This customised accessibility guide provides convenient information about accessing this centre. Access Keys are universally designed and suitable for all people, regardless of ability.

For your Access Key to be successful, we recommend you follow these guidelines.

- Access Keys are available online to help you prepare for your visit in advance.
- · Access Keys should be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.
- Access Keys can be read independently or shared with a friend, family member, carer or support worker to prepare for the visit.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, help participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.
- If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.
- Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.



















































Did you know?

- Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre is operated and run by Melton City Council.
- It is a multi-purpose facility, offering youth services, community services and programs, spaces for hire, recreational spaces and a base for large scale events.

Getting There

Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre is located at 121 Calder Park Drive, Taylors Hill.

The Sunbury/Watergardens line towards Sunbury will get you there. The nearest station is Watergardens Railway Station, 3.8 kilometres from Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre.



The nearest bus stop is on Calder Park
Drive, (outside the Taylors Hill Retirement
Village),160 metres from Taylors Hill Youth
and Community Centre. Bus route 462 will
get you there. The 461 stops at Calder Park/
Hume Drive bus stop which is located 350m
from the Taylors Hill Youth and Community
Centre.

Parking

The most convenient parking is within a designated car park on-site.

There is:

- three accessible parking bays located 50 metres from the entrance to the centre
- general parking with no restrictions
- street parking in Omarama Way, with no restrictions
- bus parking in the car park on-site
- bike racks undercover at the entrance to the centre.



Welcome

Welcome to Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre

Entry to the centre is through a double set of automated sliding doors with a clearance of 1560mm.

There is an undercover area outside the entrance.

Bench seating is available out the front of the centre.

Reception is directly ahead of the centre entry doors.

There is a wheelchair accessible reception desk at a height of 835mm AFFL, with a knee clearance of 800mm AFFL.

In the reception area there are armchairs with back and armrests, as well as informational brochures on local community programs, events and support services.

Centre operating hours vary day to day based on the youth and community programs on offer.


The centre also has hirers that use the space, during the day, in the evening and on weekends.

Reception at the centre is not always staffed so to receive support or information, community members are advised to call ahead on (03) 9747 5422 and make an appointment, as the centre is not equipped for walk-ins.

Staff

Community centre staff and Youth Workers at Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre dress casually and wear lanyards, keys and security passes.

When they are working outside in the community, Youth Workers wear light blue or purple polo shirts and hoodies that feature the logos of "City of Melton" and "Young Communities." Additionally, they wear a bright blue vest with the words "Youth Worker" printed on the back.

Toilets

Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre has one set of public toilets

Location: Past reception, through the hallway and to the right.

Includes:

- all genders, accessible toilet with sensor lighting
- manual door opening inward. Door clearance of 860mm. Twist lock at 1230mm AFFL
- cubicle space 2375mm x 2485mm
- grab bars to the right and behind toilet
- toilet height 470mm AFFL with right hand transfer
- sink height 820mm AFFL with lever tap 960mm AFFL
- sanitary bin
- baby change.

Separate men/boys and women/girl's toilets.

Community Rooms

There are three community rooms at Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre.

Community rooms one and two are past reception and the toilets, on the right. There is a dividing door between these rooms that can be opened to make one large room.

These rooms are used for a range of social and recreational programs for people of all ages.

Inclusions:

kitchenette with sink, microwave, and instant hot water

- tables
- seats with backrests
- access to industrial kitchen (community room one)
- projector (community room one)
- large wall mounted mirrors that can be covered with pull down blinds (community room one)
- lights that can be dimmed on request.

Community room three is located at the end of the hallway, on the left. This room permanently houses the Caroline Springs RSL.

Entry to each community room is through a manual door, opening inward with a clearance of 850mm. These can be opened to double doors.

Industrial Kitchen

The industrial kitchen is located off community room one

Community groups are required to bring their own food.

Entry is through a manual door, opening inward with a clearance of 850mm.

Includes:

- two ovens
- fridge
- microwave
- dishwasher
- sinks
- coffee machine
- hot water urn
- storage cupboards
- servery counter to community room one at a height of 900mm AFFL.

Interview Rooms

There are four interview rooms at Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre

Location:

- 1. Pass reception and the toilets
- 2. Follow along the hallway
- 3. Pass community rooms one and two
- 4. Enter through a door opening inward with a clearance of 850mm
- 5. Interview rooms are on the left.

These rooms are used for staff to have confidential conversations with young people and community members seeking support.

They are also bookable spaces for service providers to meet with community members and can be booked as ongoing office spaces.

Entry to each interview room is through a manual door, opening inward with a clearance of 850mm.

Includes:

- tables
- seats with backrests.

Courtyard

There is one courtyard at Taylors Hill Youth and Community Centre.

It is located past reception opposite community rooms one and two.

The courtyard is used for youth and community programs and events.

Entry is through manual doors, opening inward with a clearance of 850mm. These can be opened to double doors.

Courtyard surface is a combination of smooth concrete and aggregate concrete.

Includes:

- small undercover area
- trees for shade
- barbecue
- external gates leading to skate park with a clearance of 950mm.

The internet lounge is used for supervised social and recreational programs for young people aged 12–25 years.

Young Communities has a range of programs, services, and events available to young people aged 12–25 who live, study, work or recreate in the City of Melton.



- Exit buttons at entry doors 1020mm AFFL.
- Varied external terrain of concrete, pavers and grass.
- Varied internal terrain of carpet and linoleum.
- Wide, clear internal and external walkways.
- Clear wheelchair circulation space.
- Spaces for a person using a wheelchair to sit with friends.
- Scooter parking available in reception area.
- Free Wi-Fi in internet lounge. Password required.
- · Quiet spaces are available.

- Accessible playground and play space fully fenced.
- Outdoor lighting at front of centre and at skate park.
- Pen and paper or exchanging information.
- Staff supportive of LGBTIQA+ community.
- Staff available to read information to visitors.
- Assistance animals welcome.

- Lectern height 1000mm AFFL.
- Room one and two table heights 730mm AFFL with knee clearance 680mm AFFL.
- Room one water fountain height 1040mm AFFL.
- Kitchenette manual door opens inward with clearance 850mm AFFL.
- Kitchenette bench height 900mm AFFL.

Industrial Kitchen

- Island bench with wheels height 910mm AFFL.
- Kitchen bench height 900mm AFFL.

Interview Rooms

- Table heights 735mm AFFL with knee clearance 650mm AFFL.
- Courtyard
- Barbecue height 970mm AFFL.

Internet Lounge

- Computer table heights 705mm AFFL with knee clearance 670mm AFFL.
- Foosball table height 900mm AFFL.
- Table tennis height 765mm AFFL.
- Pool table height 860mm AFFL.

Safety

Throughout

- TGSI from entry doors to carpark.
- No smoking or vaping.
- Alcohol and drug free venue.
- Children to be actively supervised.
- Wet floor signage may be displayed.
- All staff have Working with Children Checks.
- Evacuation maps.
- No Fire Wardens on site due to being unstaffed centre.
- First aid kit in reception. Hirers are advised to bring own first aid kits.
- Defibrillator on hallway wall, past reception area, on the left.
- Illuminated exit signs.
- Violent behaviour not tolerated.
- Audible alerts in the case of an emergency.
- Hirers are requested to familiarise themselves with the centre evacuation map. In the event of an emergency, staff may not be available to help and direct visitors. If there is to be an evacuation, visitors need to go to the nearest exit and designated assembly area. Assembly areas are on front lawn and at the rear of the centre.
